St. Mary's Framsden Parish record – 2022

- 1. The Church organised eight fundraising and social events during 2022. £2,068.81 was raised for church funds.
- 2. The Parish share (Quota) of £4,493.00 was paid in full. This amount is Framsden's contribution to the Revd Susan Taylor's salary.
- Our service pattern remained the same i.e. Morning Prayer and Holy Communion occurring during the 2nd and 3rd Sunday of each month at 9.30am and 11am respectively.
- 4. The Christmas Eve service, as in 2021, took place at 5pm on Christmas Eve and was a great success.
- 5. Richard and Christine Schofield completed their Basic awareness and Foundation Safeguard training. Results registered at Diocesan House as required and valid until March 15th, 2025.
- 6. Due to problems with Allister Compton's electric fencing, no sheep were able to graze within the churchyard. It was agreed by the PCC and Allister that new fencing would be (and has been) purchased for 2023 and will be installed next spring after the daffodils etc., have gone over.
- 7. The Rural Coffee Caravan continued to visit the village on a monthly basis and has been well supported – particularly during late Spring and summer when there's the opportunity to sit outside.
- 8. The Pyronix Roof Alarm and Fire Extinguishers were all tested successfully.
- 9. In order to carry out investigative work of the Chancel Roof, we await a free survey and follow up report to be undertaken by the Bat Conservation Trust. The survey should take place during Spring 2023.
- 10. A Book Exchange was suggested and instigated during November last year. Books are located near the Vestry in church and the fabulous idea of Mrs. Sandy Barron. The Book Exchange is used on a regular basis.
